New Year Clubnight - 15th January 2014

I had discussed with Dad and Mathew to see if they wanted to carry on competing together on the 2014 12 car championship, and they said that they wanted to. So this leaves poor old No.2 Son left searching for a driver, This isn't much of a problem as I don't really mind changing drivers as I find its always a different challenge.

I contacted Ed Haylock to see if he wanted to compete with me on the New years clubnight but unfortunately Ed's shift pattern made him unavailable for the event so after a little bit of begging Daisy said that she would take up the task. I had a chat with Daisy on the way to the event and said to her that we should keep calm with each other and just have a relaxed night and whatever happens happens. Daisy kept saying "yea that's fine, but we are going to win"

We signed on and I was waiting in the car ready to leave the start feeling ok about the event. I undid the first envelope to see $\underline{v} \times 8$. This meant to cross 8 electricity transmission lines. This took us on a few loops around Tilney all saints. Where we found Andy Congreve on a secret passage control and then to Tc1 where we found Greg and Judy Dropped 1 minute here.

Tc1 to Tc2 consisted of a string on numbers with a triangle thrown it. This was a mixture of grid references and Grid lines to cross. We had a wrong slot just after Tc1 and the last grid reference in the string caused me some confusion costing us a further 5 minutes. Mark and Paul were flying here only dropping 2 minutes

Tc2 to Tc3 a long string of letters. Which the conversion code was A=1 B=2 C=3 D=4 Simple you may think but with grid references and spot heights thrown in together to test our minds. We Found Simon here and another 3 minutes Dropped, Tony and Chloe cleaned this section. Mark and Paul were flying dropping another minute making their total 3 minutes,

Tc4 to Tc6 20 squares with dots marked on them for entering and exiting the grid Squares. The only odd part was that the order went from top to bottom instead of left to right. This took us through Walpole Highway to Dave Sooley at an intermediate control and Across the A47. No problems with this section for us. But Mark and Paul missed the intermediate Control. We Found Jody Wilson at Tc6. Everyone was on time other than Mark and Paul who had gone back to look for a loop they had missed.

Tc6 to Tc7 a list of grid references that had to have distances measure from in different directions e.g 0.9 mile S of 514091, after plotting the references I realised I had some marks from a previous event so had to check my plots costing us 3 minutes at Steve Tilburn's control. Bob and Brian, John and Ian and Tony and Chloe were all clean.

Tc7 to Tc8 was a string of letters but only A B C and D were used so I looked it worked out it was to cross gridlines A=North B=South C=East D= West. Most Crews were clean here but Mathew and Paul missed a Board.

Tc8 to finish A circular herringbone. The first junction we came to was a cross roads and there was only one on the section so the start point was easy to find. Going clockwise from this point fitted well so we went with that. We managed to get stuck at some traffic lights on a bad bend that seemed to take forever to change. Managed to get to the finish without dropping anymore time.

This Left us with 0 Fails and 13 Minutes with Alan and Dave in second with 0 fails and 22 Minutes. Mathew and Paul Smalley won the Novice class with 4 Fails 32 Minutes. But the novices did have semi- expert hand-outs. Tony and Chloe won the Beginner class with 0 fails 12 Minutes.

A massive thank you to Colin and Elaine for organising the event, Greg and Judy for sponsoring the food at the finish, and all of the marshals who came out to man the controls because without you the event wouldn't happen.

Competition Secretary's notes

(aka Tony Hewitt's very occasional diary)

Well it's been a while, unfortunately the house, wife and kids have had to come first for a while [mainly the kids] so sorry for the delay.

The last twelve months have been very busy, but the rally car has only done 20 miles, Fred my ten year old has now got a karting year behind him, he covered a full year at Ellough kart club championship, coming 6th out of 38 in the championship.

This is the hardest discipline of motorsport I've ever seen. It's the angry parents; they shout, swear and force their kids to do things which I'm already seeing kids scared of crashing or breaking anything.

Fred has been not a winner but consistently in the top 8 out of a 25 kart race, some days lower depending on the weather. He gets either wet tyres or slicks but seems to go well in difficult conditions. He's also done a few at red lodge with mixed results again but roughly the same, all with a project one cadet kart and a Honda gx 160 lawn mower engine that does a constant 55 mph so that's cost more than the roof on the house already.

So, back to the SCCoN event, this one carrying the "don't do what you know, do what you're told" somewhere in Norfolk I recognise a road and she says turn right here all I

see is mud and leaves so carry on for a mile but missed the junction needed. Getting back missing two long way again, but finished 8th.

Back to the Lynn event, and Peter's off-road event.
