#### The Myotis Rally 2014

Mark Banham and David Smalley car 21

We first competed on the Myotis last year. We were having a good run till a wrong turn and we ended up getting stuck. When we eventually got ourselves un-stuck but we were running OTL leaving us with a poor result but loved the roads so we had to go back and take part on the 2014 event.

The Myotis is a 200 mile road event on and around Salisbury Plain. Last year the tracks were lovely wide, smooth, flowing gravel roads which sometimes had no resemblance to the o/s map we were given.

This year's event was some of the same but the tracks had deteriorated and became heavily rutted in places.

The road book was only given to us on the start line and we had a long list of amendments to make so any free time we had was spent plotting the amendments.

Up to the first test we had dropped 2 minutes mostly caused by wrong slots and poor marking of the route and passage checks on the map. It was a struggle to make back any time because if you got anywhere near the car in front the dust was impossible to see through. At one point we had a Volvo 30 meters in front and all we could see was dust.

Test 1 and 2, we could remember some of the test from the year before. Mark Drove superbly and managed to set second fastest time on both tests. We were very lucky that because of our initial speed we got in front of the cars on the merge meaning clear runs on both of them.

The rest of the first have went to plan and other than lots more dust. We got to petrol halt and had a quick clean up and top up on the car and we were away again back to the plain.

All was going well until we got into some woods with a different scale map as a plan. Mark was really on it through here and as I said "we need to take a left here somewhere" we were past it and entered a control with an incorrect approach missing a code board on the loop. This gave us 30 minute penalty for the wrong approach and a 10 minute penalty for the board. Gutted.

We managed to set 4<sup>th</sup> fastest time on the final test event though it was very dusty for us.

Getting towards the end of the event we found we had one map missing. Will a little bit of help following another crew and guessing a route we managed to get around the problem only missing one board. This was later scrubbed from the results as it was organiser's error.

Overall we managed to come 8<sup>th</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup> in class. Dave Bell Managed to come 6<sup>th</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> in class even though he approached the same control incorrect.

A very good event with a few problems, But I don't think there is another event like it.
